C-ID Updates

Conditional Approval

Due to questions regarding the function of Conditional Approval from the field, we have included a brief summary of how the status of Conditional Approval works in the C-ID review process.

When courses are submitted to C-ID, they are reviewed by three discipline faculty reviewers who are appointed by their respective Academic Senates. The reviewers conduct a holistic review of the COR to reach a final determination based on a consensus. Where there are substantial differences in determinations (e.g. one reviewer determines "not approved" and two reviewers determine "approved") the primary reviewer communicates with reviewers to resolve the discrepancy.

Conditionally approved courses are sent back to colleges with written feedback on what the COR is missing, and AOs or curriculum specialists communicate the reviewer feedback to the discipline faculty to modify the COR. If a revised COR is not resubmitted within one year, the conditionally approved determination defaults to Expired.

Courses with a final determination of "Not Approved" differ substantially from the C-ID descriptor. Examples would be courses lacking lab content where the C-ID descriptor requires lab or lab courses being submitted for lecture courses (C-ID descriptors without lab topics are understood to be lecture-only courses). Or courses not at an appropriate level (e.g. a nonmajors course for a majors course).
