Update to BUS 140 and ITIS 120 Descriptor:

As you may know, there have been ongoing conversations regarding the descriptors for BUS 140 and ITIS 120. While the descriptors are the same, the discipline course reviewers review and treat them differently, such that receiving designation for one does not necessarily mean automatic designation for the other.

The faculty discipline review group (FDRG) for Business, and Information Technology/Information Systems agreed to remove the notation for the other descriptor, as both are not truly cross-listed descriptors. Achieving designation for one descriptor does not necessarily mean designation for the other; your college must submit for both descriptors separately.

Studio Arts TMC, List B Descriptors:

The Studio Arts FDRG is proposing the removal of the following List B descriptors in the TMC:

ARTS 220, 230, 240, 260, 280, 281, and 282

Although the proposal is to remove the descriptors, the intent is to keep the areas represented in the TMC, but requiring *articulation as major preparation* instead of a C-ID designation for inclusion in your ADT. We've researched a number of the descriptors and found very few instances of courses that don't have such articulation. In other words, the TMC is not being changed - just the use of C-ID to specify some courses.

Course Substitutions & Local Control:

C-ID continues to get questions about when a course substitution is permitted. As delineated in the [Reciprocity document](#), the local college's obligation is to ensure that the degree awarded is consistent with the TMC. The determination of when a course substitution is permissible is generally a local matter. The exception to this would be an instance when a C-ID designation is required for a given course and the course is clearly inconsistent with the descriptor, such as when a required prerequisite is missing. Recent conversations on the CIAC listserv have highlighted the importance of maintaining local control of these determinations and of ensuring decisions are appropriately student-friendly.

Submitting CORs for Descriptors:

We have had a number of course outlines submitted for incorrect descriptors, e.g. a Physical Geology outline for a Historical Geology lab descriptor. Please make sure to work with your discipline faculty to identify the correct descriptor to submit your course outline and let us know if

DISCIPLINE UPDATE:

Social Justice Studies & Global Studies:

Both the Social Justice Studies and Global Studies faculty discipline review group (FDRG) completed the work on the Area of Emphasis TMCs for both disciplines. The TMCs are now posted on the C-ID website, under the “TMC” tab. We anticipate the CCC Chancellor’s Office templates for both will be available February 1, 2016. Agriculture:

Hospitality:

C-ID is attending a meeting for the Hospitality discipline on Oct 23 to facilitate work on a draft Hotel Management TMC and related descriptors. We will notify the listservs once draft documents are available for vetting.

FDRG Updates:

The FDRGs for Graphic Arts/ Graphic Design and Environmental Science met in mid-September to continue the discussion on the creation of a TMC and any associated descriptors for their disciplines.
