Discipline Convening - 3/28/2014:

CCC faculty discipline review groups (CCCFDRG) for automotive technology, biotechnology, and emergency medical services met to develop descriptors for their respective disciplines. Once drafts are available for review, the draft descriptors will be posted on the C-ID website for vetting statewide. The Course Outline of Record Evaluators (COREs) for biology, chemistry, mathematics, music, and political science also met during the March 28 meeting to engage in norming exercises and to review course outlines of record. All of the disciplines made significant progress, but all of these disciplines are still in need of additional CSU reviewers. C-ID Advisory Committee Update:

The C-ID Advisory Committee met on April 15. The Descriptor Review Process and the C-ID COR Determination Appeal Process were both finalized. A policy on prerequisites is being developed, as are guidelines relating to determining when a C-ID descriptor is solely intrasegmental and does not need intersegmental review. It is anticipated that disciplines will be identifying "CCC only" courses when they undergo their first review cycle.

Child and Adolescent Development

Nutrition/Dietetics

Information Technology/Information Systems

The ITIS FDRG met in late March to discuss the results of the vetting of the Information and Communication Technology model curriculum. After consideration, changes were made to the model curriculum and it will be presented to the ICFW for acceptance.

Spanish

The Spanish FDRG was asked to provide language clarifying the prerequisite for "Spanish for Heritage Speakers I" (C-ID SPAN 220) as the descriptor indicates a course for non-native speakers and indicates "or equivalent". The FDRG members were queried and approved the following: "Or equivalent may mean a comparable course for heritage speakers or any form of assessment used by the college to determine that the student possesses a basic speaking knowledge of Spanish."
