Notice: C-ID Site Search Function Errors

It has come to our attention that some CSU submission listings have not been populating while users access the search function from the C-ID site. We have notified the C-ID Tech Center, and the issue is currently being addressed. We will send an announcement to notify all C-ID site users when this issue has been resolved. C-ID Discipline Updates

Agriculture TMCs & Descriptors - 5-Year Review Complete

We are pleased to announce the Agriculture Faculty Discipline Review Group (FDRG) has now completed the review of the three (3) Agriculture TMCs (Agriculture-Animal Science, Agriculture-Plant Science and Agriculture-Agriculture Business) and twenty-one (21) descriptors.

The FDRG made the following non-substantive changes to List A of the Agriculture-Plant Science, and Agriculture-Animal Science TMCs: Addition of CHEM 102: Introduction to Organic and Biochemistry as an "OR" option to CHEM 150: Organic Chemistry for Science Majors I, with Lab.

Additionally, all three Agriculture TMCs (Agriculture-Plant Science, Agriculture-Animal Science, and Agriculture-Business) were updated with minor language revisions in List B.

Non-substantive changes were made to the following descriptors:

- AG-PS 104 Updates to objectives/content
- AG-PS 106 L Updates to objectives/content.
- AG-PS 128 L Updates to objectives/content.
- AG-EH 108 L Minor wording updates.
- AG-EH 112 L Minor wording updates.
- AG-AB 108 Minor wording updates.

Total Courses Submitted for C-ID Articulation: 34,067

Total Courses Approved for C-ID Articulation: 25,173 Please note that the Agriculture FDRG considers the updates to be non-substantive and colleges are not required to resubmit updated CORs to maintain C-ID approval as a result of the changes.

<u>Film, Television & Electronic Media (FTVE) Updated TMC &</u> Descriptors – Course Resubmission

As a reminder, the Five (5) Year Review for FTVE was recently finalized. The FTVE Faculty Discipline Review Group (FDRG) recommended a substantial change to the TMC. The new version has been posted to the C-ID website.

What Colleges with FTVE ADTs Must Do:

Colleges may now begin developing their new versions of the FTVE ADT for submission to the California Community College Chancellor's Office as the new FTVE transfer template is now available on the <u>CCCCO website</u>. According to the <u>TMC Review and Revision Criteria</u> <u>and Process During 5-Year Review</u> document on the C-ID webpage, colleges must complete their program revisions within one year.

What Has Changed:

The FDRG developed a new descriptor, C-ID FTVE 115 Introduction to Screenwriting, which is now included in the core of the TMC. Additionally, substantive changes requiring resubmission of course outlines of record to C-ID for review were made to the following descriptors: FTVE 110, FTVE 125, and FTVE 150.

According to the C-ID Descriptor Review Process, in the event that a C-ID descriptor changes substantially due to a 5-year review, necessitating re-submission and re-review, colleges will have one year to resubmit the COR to C-ID. The FDRG will determine whether resubmissions of approved courses will require a full or an expedited review.

In instances where there are delays in C-ID review, the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office allows ADTs to be approved if courses have been submitted to C-ID, and they have been pending a C-ID review for more than 45 days. Courses pending review may remain in the review queue if, in the judgment of college discipline faculty, the submitted Course Outline appears to match the revised C-ID descriptor. Please note when resubmitting courses with revisions that previous submissions pending review must be withdrawn (deleted) so that there are not two courses (one current and one outdated) in the queue, and the submission of the updated course needs to be made within one year. If a college needs to withdraw a COR that is pending review, the colleges with approved ADTs or ADTs pending approval will need to save archived documentation (e.g. a screenshot) that the course was pending review. The FTVE TMC and descriptors are now available on the <u>C-ID website</u>.

<u>Faculty Response Needed – Engineering 5-Year Review –</u> <u>Proposed Changes</u>

The Course Identification Numbering System (C-ID) is seeking feedback regarding proposed changes to the descriptors and Model Curriculum (MC) for the Engineering Five (5) Year Review. The purpose of reviewing the C-ID descriptors and TMC on a 5-year cycle is two-fold:

1. To ensure that descriptors are current and reflect changes in the field that would necessarily impact curriculum.

2. To provide an opportunity to revise elements of descriptors that were deemed problematic.

We are now seeking input on the proposed changes to the descriptors and MC. The information gathered from this survey will be reviewed by the Faculty Discipline Review Group (FDRG) and used to guide the 5-year review process.
